<u>The Regular September 9th, 2025, Board of Supervisors meeting convened at 6:32 PM.</u>

Chairman Dennie welcomed residents and called the meeting to order at 6:32 PM. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Chairman Dennie requested everyone to please

silence all electronic equipment and announced the presence of a recording device for the purpose of minute taking. The recording will be deleted once the minutes are approved at the following meeting. Chairman Dennie mentioned that the Township is livestreaming this meeting on its official YouTube channel. An executive session took place immediately prior to the meeting to discuss legal, real estate, and personnel matters.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Motion to approve the minutes for the Regular Board of Supervisors' Meeting held on August 12th, 2025.

Motion: On a motion by Vice-Chair DerOhannessian, seconded by Supervisor lacono and carried unanimously, the Board approved the regular meeting minutes of August 12th, 2025.

REPORTS:

TREASURER REPORT:

Peter Barsz, the Township Treasurer, submitted a summary to the Board. Details by fund are included within the report, which is on record at the Township building and is available for public inspection.

Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report, pay bills and release all relevant escrows.

Motion: On a motion by Chairman Dennie, seconded by Vice-Chair DerOhannessian and carried unanimously, the Board approved the August 2025 Treasurer's Report and payment of all bills as presented.

FINANCE/AUDIT/TAXES:

Supervisor D'Agostino corrected that agenda item i. under Finance should say 2026 minimum obligation and not 2025.

Motion to accept the 2026 minimum municipal obligation for the employee's retirement plan in the amount \$34,000.00.

Motion: On a motion by Chairman Dennie, seconded by Supervisor Iacono and carried unanimously, the Board accepted the 2026 minimum municipal obligation for the employee's retirement plan in the amount \$34,000.00.

<u>Tax Collector Report</u>: Chairman Dennie read the August 2025 Tax Collector's Report. A copy of the full Tax Collector's Report is available at the Township building for public inspection.

PUBLIC SAFETY:

Police Department: Chief McCarthy read the August 2025 Police Report. A full copy of the Police Report is available for public inspection at the Township building.

Chief McCarthy gave a presentation on stop sticks obtained through a grant from Vest-A-Cop. He noted that the devices are single-use and can be replaced for \$500 each.

Bethel Hose Co. #1: Supervisor D'Agostino read the August 2025 Fire Report. A copy of the full Fire Department Report is available at the Township building for public inspection.

Motion to approve the release of \$11,583.00 from the Fire Tax Fund for the 2025 PEMA loan payment on Truck 66.

Motion: On a motion by Supervisor D'Agostino, seconded by Chairman Dennie and carried unanimously, the Board approved the release of \$11,583.00 from the Fire Tax Fund for the 2025 PEMA loan payment on Truck 66.

Supervisor D'Agostino explained the Volunteer Firefighter Real Estate Tax Credit Program; Bethel Township can advertise an Ordinance stating that volunteers with the fire company may be eligible for a real estate tax refund by mail after meeting specific criteria.

Ed Plasha, Township Tax Collector, stated that this only applies to certain taxes, not the trash fee.

Joe Connors, 3317 Foulk Road, asked whether the program applies only to property owners or if it also covers firefighters who reside in the home.

Michael Maddren, the Township Solicitor, stated that this is for the property owner only. They are also looking into reciprocity from other townships if they honor the same program.

Motion to authorize the solicitor to advertise an ordinance implementing a volunteer firefighter real estate tax credit program pursuant to Act 172 of 2016.

Motion: On a motion by Supervisor D'Agostino, seconded by Supervisor Iacono and carried unanimously, the Board authorized the Township Solicitor to advertise an ordinance implementing a volunteer firefighter real estate tax credit program pursuant to Act 172 of 2016.

<u>Emergency Medical Services:</u> Supervisor Iacono read the August 2025 Emergency Medical Services Report. A copy of the full Emergency Medical Services Report is available at the Township building for public inspection.

Motion to authorize Millennium Strategies to assist the Township in preparing and submitting Local Share Grant applications for Shaffer Preserve, Goodley Road Culvert, and Sharon Basin projects in an amount not to exceed \$6,300.00.

Supervisor lacono stated that we did apply for these programs last year. There is a meeting scheduled this month to discuss awards for grants, but this meeting has been pushed to later months in the past. Supervisor lacono said that it is unlikely for there to be any grant announcements this month, but if we do receive any awards, we may not need this motion. She also stated that we budgeted \$40,000.00 for this service and only \$8,000.00 has been used to date.

Motion: On a motion by Supervisor Iacono, seconded by Chairman Dennie, with Supervisor Davey opposed, the Board approved Millennium Strategies to assist the Township in preparing and submitting Local Share Grant applications for Shaffer Preserve, Goodley Road Culvert, and Sharon Basin projects in an amount not to exceed \$6,300.00 in a 4 to 1 vote.

George Lincoln, 1418 Deer Meadow Lane, asked for more information about how we have used Millenium Strategies so far and if their services have been used to submit grants for the Goodley Culvert project and Shaffer Preserve.

Dianne Smith, 1602 Wendy Way, expressed concerns with the success of Millenium Strategies and if there will be an analysis at the end of the year to evaluate their success.

Supervisor lacono stated that we don't have enough information to give an accurate evaluation at this time. The Board would need to wait a full cycle to be able to evaluate and analyze their success.

Donna Vance, 1612 Wendy Way, asked how much of the \$40,000.00 budgeted have we used on Millennium Strategies.

Supervisor lacono reiterated we have only used \$8,000.00 to date.

Junior Supervisor Consiglio explained her findings to the audience.

Vice-Chair DerOhannessian asked Junior Supervisor Consiglio about the extent of the damage Garnet Valley High School sustained during the recent storms.

Junior Supervisor Consiglio reported that the auditorium was damaged; much of the flooring has been removed and needs to be replaced. The Drama Club is concerned about when repairs will be completed.

During the month of September there were 13 invoices collected for 2025 taxes. The total tax collected for September was \$11,437.44 and was remitted to the Township in one installment: October 5, 2025. The breakdown is as follows:

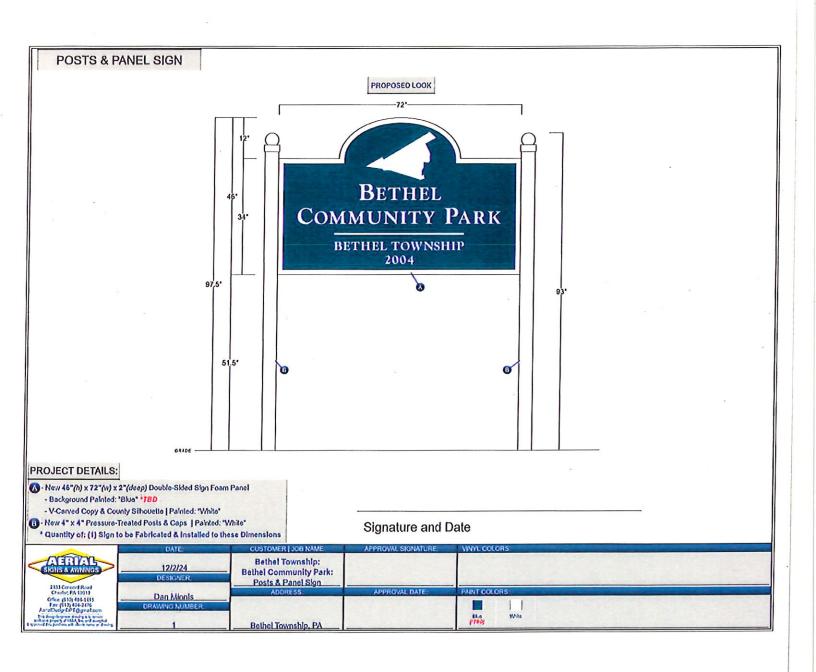

Review of the GVSD Screen Smart Initiative

Source: Email communications from Superintendent Marc Bertrando, September 29, 2025, and October 7, 2025 (edited for brevity)

Over the past two weeks, my central office team has conducted a time study at our two secondary schools through 54 random spot observations during the school day. I'm encouraged by what we've seen: at the middle school, not a single phone was observed in classrooms, and during class changes in the hallways, only five students were seen with their phones out. At the high school, just two phones were observed in classrooms during that same period. Although there is still plenty of work to do, these results give me confidence that Screen Smart GV is already making a real difference, and I am grateful for the partnership of our students, staff, and families in this important work.

Screen Smart GV in October:

This October, Garnet Valley will join schools across the country in raising awareness around digital literacy, technology balance, and wellness. Aligned with Digital Citizenship Week, our focus will be on helping students and families learn the safe, ethical, and responsible use of technology and media. This includes important topics such as online safety, cyberbullying prevention, media literacy, and managing one's digital footprint.

Ordinance No. 243

Open Burning

AN ORDINANCE OF BETHEL TOWNSHIP, DELAWARE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA PROHIBITING THE BURNING OF CERTAIN MATERIALS; ESTABLISHING EXCEPTIONS FOR OPEN BURNING; REQUIRING A PERMIT FOR AND REGULATING ANY BURNING PURSUANT TO SUCH EXCEPTIONS: EXCEPTING CERTAIN MINIMALLY IMPACTFUL RESIDENTIAL USES OF OPEN FLAME; REGULATING THE HANDLING OF ASH AND RUBBISH RESULTING FROM OPEN BURNING; ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS; AND REPEALING ALL INCONSISTENCIES.

1. Prohibited acts.

In accordance with Pennsylvania Act 101, as amended, and 25 Pa. Code § 129.14, it shall be unlawful for any person to openly burn any material, including the following, at any time in any area within the Township: household trash, books, magazines, newspapers, cardboard and/ or any items that are required to be recycled in Bethel Township under Pennsylvania Act 101, including yard waste, leaves and scrap lumber or any vegetation, plywood, drywall, plastic products, insulation materials, upholstered furniture, solid waste and/or construction waste as defined by the Pennsylvania Solid Waste Management Act and 25 Pa. Code § 271.1, garbage, dead animals, human and animal excrement, human and animal hair, rubber products, including tires, hydrocarbon products or flammable liquids, asphalt or tar shingles or roofing materials, bedding, foam rubber, nylon, rayon, cotton, wool, polyester or other synthetic material, insulation from copper or other wiring.

2. Exceptions.

The prohibition of open burning shall be in effect except when the burning results from the following and is conducted in such a manner as to comply with 25 Pa. Code § 129.14:

An open burning set to prevent or abate a fire hazard when approved by the Department of A. Environmental Protection regional office and set by or under the supervision of a public officer.

- A fire set for the purpose of instructing personnel in firefighting, when approved by the Department of Environmental Protection regional office.
- A fire set for the prevention and control of disease or pests, when approved by the Department of Environmental Protection regional office.
- A fire set for the purpose of burning, clearing and grubbing waste; should Bethel Township become included in the inner zone of Southeast Pennsylvania air basin, or any other air basin defined in 25 Pa. Code § 121.1, an air curtain destructor must be used and must be approved by the Department of Environmental Protection regional office.
- A fire set in conjunction with the production of agricultural commodities in their unmanufactured state on the premises of the farm operation.
- F. A fire fueled by charcoal or untreated wood set solely for cooking food.
- A fire fueled by untreated wood set solely for recreational or ceremonial purposes. G.

3. Regulations and requirements.

- Any such open burning as permitted in Section 2 shall be located at least 50 feet or more from any building, structure or combustible materials and at least 25 feet from any property line, public street or right-of-way.
- Burning pursuant to Section 2 shall require a permit from the Township. The Township is authorized to charge a fee for said permit in an amount established by resolution of the Board of Supervisors, as may be modified from time to time. However, no open burning is permitted on any day on which the National Weather Service (www.nws.noaa.gov) has issued a red flag warning for areas encompassing the Township. The Township Fire Marshal may suspend open burning at any time and from time to time when he determines, in his sole discretion any of the following conditions exist:
 - (1) The National Weather Service has issued a red flag warning for any area of the Township.
 - (2) Smoke, embers and/or ash emission cause damage to property or vegetation of adjacent properties.
 - (3) Smoke, embers and/or ash emission are, or may be, offensive, objectionable or deleterious to human or animal health.

- (4) In the opinion of the Township Fire Marshall dry conditions or drought warrant a ban on all open burning, and such ban is posted on the Township website.
- (5) The burn is being conducted in such a manner as to be violative of or result in a violation of the provisions of 25 Pa. Code § 129.14
- All fires in open burning must be guarded or attended to by one or more responsible adult persons, being individuals 18 or over, at all times until such fire and open burning has been extinguished.
- Yard waste that is permitted to be burned on agricultural land must originate from the same parcel of land on which it is burned.
- Nonorganic or recyclable materials, or any other combustibles which may create large amounts of E. smoke, may not be openly burned.
- Any such open burning shall be permitted between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. No burning F. or smoldering shall occur outside the above time period, unless prior permission is requested of and expressly granted by the Township.
- 4. Outdoor fireplaces, cooking grills and patio stoves; chimineas; factory-built metal novelty stoves.
- Outdoor fireplaces, outdoor cooking grills, outdoor patio stoves, chimineas and factory-built metal novelty stoves shall be permitted upon private property within all zones of the Township solely for their intended purpose.
- No person shall use outdoor fireplaces, outdoor cooking grills, outdoor patio stoves, chimineas and factory-built metal novelty stoves for the burning of material as outlined in Section 1.
- Outdoor fireplaces, outdoor cooking grills, outdoor patio stoves, chimineas and factory-built metal C. novelty stoves may not be used indoors or in any enclosed areas that are not properly ventilated.
 - 5. Indoor fireplaces; wood-burning and coal stoves; solid-fuel heaters.
- Fireplaces or wood-burning or coal stoves shall be permitted inside residential private property within all zones of the Township solely for the purpose of heating the dwelling unit.
- Only seasoned firewood, coal or solid fuels recommended by the manufacturer may be burned in В. such fireplaces, wood-burning or coal stoves or solid-fuel heaters.

- No person may use such fireplaces, wood-burning or coal stoves or solid-fuel heaters for the burning of any material as outlined in Section 1.
- Such fireplaces, wood-burning or coal stoves or solid-fuel heaters shall not be used for such purpose when, in the judgment of a Township or fire official, a fire hazard is created by such use and operation and/or any danger is posed to the occupants therein or the neighboring buildings and/or occupants.
- If the smoke, ashes and/or smell emitting to the outside atmosphere from the chimney, stovepipe or flue are objectionable or offensive to the general public, the operation of such fireplace, woodburning or coal stove or solid-fuel heater shall be suspended by any Township or fire official.
 - 6. Handling of ashes and rubbish.

Ashes, smoldering coals, wood and embers or other material liable to spontaneously ignite shall not be deposited or allowed to remain within 10 feet of any combustible materials but shall be deposited in noncombustible containers. Rubbish of any kind shall not be allowed to accumulate.

7. Compliance with state regulations.

All open burning permitted under this Ordinance shall comply with the provisions of 25 Pa. Code § 129.14, or any successor regulation governing open burning within the Township.

8. Violations.

Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance or failing to comply with any direction of the fire marshal issued pursuant hereto shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding \$1,000 for each offense, with each fire on a given day and each day constituting a separate offense. Any burning in violation of this Ordinance shall be considered a public nuisance, and the Township shall have the power to abate such nuisance and charge the violator and/or the owner of the property upon which the violations occurs with the cost of abatement. This Ordinance shall constitute a municipal air pollution ordinance for the purpose of Section 12(g) of the Pennsylvania Air Pollution Control Act and the enforcement provisions thereunder.
